Pupil Premium Allocation

Total number on children on roll (March 2016)	256
Total number of children eligible for Pupil Premium (March 2016)	74
Total amount of Pupil Premium funding received	£143,160

Pupil Premium funding comes directly into a school and is based on the number of children registered as eligible for Free School Meals at that moment or at any point in the last 6 years.

It should be noted that not all children eligible for Free School Meals are low attaining or making poor progress. Thought has been given to how we can best support high attaining Pupil Premium children as well as low attaining Pupil Premium children.

The Pupil Premium provides funding for children:

- who have been in receipt of free school meals at any point in the last six year
- who have been continuously looked after for the past six months
- for children whose parents are serving in the armed forces
