

Year 4/5 Curriculum Overview



Maths

In maths this term, we will be focusing on decimals, shape and perimeter. The children worked really hard last half term and we are excited to continue to develop our maths knowledge together.

Please continue to practice times tables facts at home.

English

This half term in English, we are focusing on the poem, 'The Highway Man' by Alfred Noyes. The poem written in 1906 tells the story of a highwayman who falls in love with an innkeeper's daughter. This topic will provide excellent creative writing opportunities.

Science

Year 4/5 will learn about 'Forces.' Forces are the things that allow movement around us. As part of this topic, we will also look at water resistance, air resistance and surface resistance.

History

This half term, Year 4/5 will be learning about 'The Kingdom of Benin.' As part of this topic, we will look at where the Ancient Kingdom of Benin was located and how it came to thrive, what the people there believed in and how they showed this in their artwork.

RE

During RE this half term, Year 4/5 will be learning about 'What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?' We will be looking at what Muslims believe, how they practice their faith and reflect on the significance of the holy Qur'an to Muslims.

PE

PE lessons will be focusing on 'athletics' with Coach Dan and 'team games' with Miss Gilmore.

French

For French this half term, our topic is 'clothes'.

Wellbeing

We will continue to place emphasis on wellbeing and we regularly reflect and take part in wellbeing activities as a class.
